Full time **UK and European** Student fees for the MSc are £5,000 for 2008/09. You can pay in 7 instalments, starting in September with £750, and then six more monthly payments of £708. As long as you hold a European passport this is your fee, regardless of where in the world you currently live.

Professionals working full time tend to do the course over two or three years, doing three modules in year one and three more in year two, and dedicating their third year for a final module and professional research report (or in two years, four modules in year one, three in year two and professional research report in the summers). Over three years, you pay £250 in September followed by six more payments of £236, with comparable fees for the two subsequent years. Over two years, you pay £375 in September and then six more payments of £354, with comparable fees for the following year.

Full time **International** Student fees for the MSc in 2008/09 are £8,000. You are required to pay 50% at the start of your course, and the remaining 50% in January. As a full time student you are entitled to two modules of free English language tuition during the year. Most visas allow international students to work up to 20 hours per week, and the distance learning and weekend tuition of our course means you are flexible as to when in the week and where in the UK you work (and live). Leeds has extensive part time work opportunities, with many job agencies and our university JobShop contracting students ([see the university's advice on how to earn while you learn](#)). If you consider applying for the [Leeds Met Overseas Student Scholarship](#) please ensure that your application to the course has been completed and accepted well in advance.

Fees do not cover residential field trips or accommodation in Leeds. The hotels we usually use cost £30 to £40 per room per night, and most students quickly partner to use twin rooms. Train prices from London can be from £30 return if you book well in advance (but £200 if you book on the day!). The one week responsible tourism in destinations and responsible hospitality audit modules use youth hostels and minibus travel to keep costs down.
